Meet Pastor Alex Smith

My name is Alex Smith.

My sister Elizabeth was born in 1993; she currently lives in Fremont, Nebraska, and works as a Lutheran school teacher at Trinity Lutheran Church and School. I was born in 1996. My brother Nate was born in 2001; he lives in Springfield, Missouri, and is still going through college for graphic design while working as a chef/cook at various restaurants. I grew up in Denison, Iowa.

My father worked at Farmland Foods for most of my life. He has now retired and works part-time at our post office in Denison. He is also a 20+ year military veteran. My mom worked for Farm Bureau Insurance Agencies until 2020 when she went to work for the Crawford County Bank. My family has always been close. I also enjoy attending sporting events no matter the level: high school, college, or upper level. I also love being around people; I think that is one of the main reasons I like sports so much; you just get to be around people. You can ask Pastor Ryan or any of the people at my congregation in Carroll if one of the kids had a ballgame and I did not have anything going on for the church I was there. Some might have seen that as work, and that's okay; I saw it as my time to relax, and I just happened to be with church members. I enjoyed doing that, and it brought me closer to them. Well, now you know more about your new Associate Pastor.

- 4. I encourage individual congregations to organize their own volunteer efforts. Just check with community leaders where their needs are.



Trustee's Corner


The (Tuckpointing) brickwork on the outside of the church is being repaired.

Back in October, I spoke a little bit about LERT (Lutheran Early Response Teams), one of the branches of LCMS mercy and missions. In light of the destructive spring weather we have had here in the Midwest, I thought it may be a good time to clarify a few things.

- 1. LERT teams are not emergency/first responders. We do not go in moments, hours, or sometimes several days after a significant event has occurred. 2. If you live in the general area, wait to find out
- 2. If something happens in your direct area, please contact your pastor and the district office if possible. We will put things into action from there.
- 3. Our team assessors go into a site once it has been declared safe for relief volunteers to enter
- 4. The goal is to work through an LCMS church in the affected area as a 'base camp'. This is not to put extra work on the pastor, leadership team, or congregation members, rather to let the community know where they can go for support in the days and weeks that follow.

Most recently IDW LERT volunteers did some work through St. John Lutheran Church, Honey Creek, after the Minden tornadoes, with the generous help of friends from the Missouri and Iowa East Districts. Some of the things that were done included:

- 1. Assisting in organizing, packing/loading items for residents, and giving help several days at the Neola Community Center where all the donations of food, toiletries, cleaning supplies, sheets, diapers/ wipes, tarps, clothes, etc...were located.
- 2. Unloading trucks and cars of donations.
- 3. Checking people in at the Community Center to make sure the people of the community were the ones getting the needed supplies.
- 4. LERT trained chainsaw teams helped take down several trees and trained volunteers walked sev-

- eral recently planted fields for cleanup at farmsteads outside of Minden.
- 5. Being a ministry of presence listening to many people who were affected by this specific storm.
- 6. Providing a day of LERT training for those not already trained.

A few things to know following an event like this:

- I. Pray for those affected!
- where donated items should go and what can be used. This is SUPER helpful! Please make sure anything donated is clean, clothes are not typically wanted right away, and always make sure any food you are donating has an expiration date of at least 6 months out. (You'd be surprised.)

Monetary donations are very helpful if you are not in the general area. Julie Mann IOWAY Director / Disaster Response Coordinator julie@iowadistrictwest.org 515-408-9696 5 3. It can sometimes be messy, muddy work but we need people with all kinds of gifts/talents to be on teams: cooking, organizing, site assessment, listening, host housing, etc.

Things to do now if you want to be involved:

- 1. Please sign up through www.LCMS-LERT.org which is the Synod's site where all communication must go through (basic training, specialized training, deployments). You can also 'fan' other districts to get notifications and help out elsewhere if possible.
- 2. Follow IOWAY on Facebook for general communication or community events like the field clean up that happened in Manilla.

Constitution and By-Law Change Proposed

At the April and May Council Meeting the following proposal was adopted to be taken to the June 23 Voter's Assembly Meeting:

Existing: TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP (cf. Constitution Article V unalterable)

Transfer of Membership - Members desiring to join a congregation in church fellowship shall present their requests for transfer to the pastor, to whom authorization is granted to issue such transfers. Such transfers shall be approved in a subsequent meeting of the Church Council.

Joining Other Churches - In cases where members have joined another congregation outside our own fellowship, they shall, upon recommendation of the pastor, be considered such as have terminated their membership, and their names shall be removed from the membership list by a resolution of the Church Council.

Whereabouts Unknown - The names of members whose whereabouts are unknown and cannot be established shall be removed by the Church Council, and forthwith such membership is terminated.

Excommunication and Self-Exclusion - Any member who conducts himself in an unchristian manner shall be admonished according to Matthew 18:15-20. If he refuses to amend his sinful life after proper admonition, he shall be excommunicated. If the member refuses to attend the Congregational Meeting to discuss his case, he has thereby excluded himself. A unanimous vote shall be required for every resolution by the Congregational Meeting for excommunication or self-exclusion. Excommunication or self-exclusion terminates membership (cf. policy adopted by Board of Elders and Church Council).

Proposed: TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP (cf. Constitution Article V unalterable)

Transfer of Membership - Members desiring to join a congregation in church fellowship shall present their requests for transfer to the pastor, to whom authorization is granted to issue such transfers. Such transfers shall be approved in a subsequent meeting of the Church Council

Joining Other Churches - In cases where members have joined another congregation outside our own fellowship, they shall, upon recommendation of the pastor, be considered such as have terminated their membership, and their names shall be removed from the membership list by a resolution of the Church Council.

Whereabouts Unknown - The names of members whose whereabouts are unknown and cannot be established shall be removed by the Church Council, and forthwith such membership is terminated.

Not Confirmed: Upon every baptized member's 21st. Birthday it will be evaluated if such member has confirmed his/her faith. If he/she has not confirmed his/her faith they will be admonished one last time according to Matthew 18 by mail and if possible in person. If there is still no response or refusal to start instruction he/she will be removed by self-exclusion.

Excommunication and Self-Exclusion - Any member who conducts himself in an unchristian manner shall be admonished according to Matthew 18:15-20. If he refuses to amend his sinful life after proper admonition, he shall be excommunicated. If the member refuses to attend the Congregational Meeting to discuss his case, he has thereby excluded himself. A unanimous vote shall be required for every resolution by the Congregational Meeting for excommunication or self-exclusion. Excommunication or self-exclusion terminates membership (cf. policy adopted by Board of Elders and Church Council).
