Holy Week at Calvary

We especially invite you and your family to come and worship at Calvary during Holy Week, March 20-27.

On Palm Sunday, March 20, we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entrance to Jerusalem with palm branches. Wednesday, March 23 will be our Service of Confession & Individual Absolution. Please note— there will be no WNAC classes or activities that evening. On Maundy Thursday, March 24, we will have two services with Holy Communion. One at 12 noon and the other at 7 pm. The 7 o'clock service will also have the "Stripping of the Altar." On Good Friday, March 25, will be the Tenebrae Service at 7 pm.

We celebrate Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, March 27 with several opportunities for worship:

- 6 am: The Sioux City LCMS churches will host the annual Sunrise Service at Stoney Creek Hotel Conference Center with music and special speakers
- 7:30 am: Calvary's Youth will serve a waffle breakfast at Calvary before each worship service.
- 8 & 10:30 am: Worship at Calvary with Holy Communion
- 9:15 am: Annual Calvary Sunday School Easter Egg Hunt

We also encourage you to attend our Mid-Week Lenten services on Wednesday evenings March 2, 9, and 16. Our sermon theme is "Becoming Contagious Christians." See page 5 for the full schedule and sermon topics.

Easter Breakfast

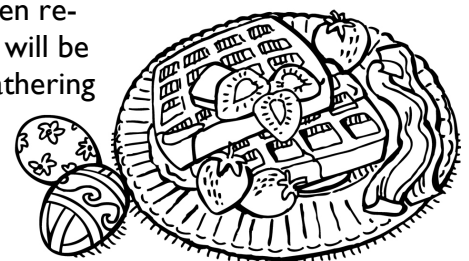

We will need lots of candy for this event as well. Please bring your sweet treats to the church and place them in the box in the Friendship Room or the church office. Thank you so much!!



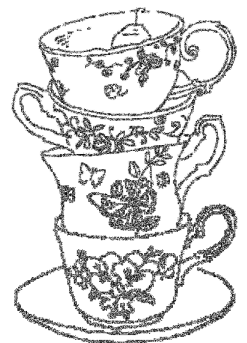
CLWL News

Q & A — Pastor Travis

Dear Christian Friends,

I have received a number of questions and concerns over the last couple of weeks and the answers deserve to be heard by all! Thank-you for these questions, which I will continue to answer with the help of the elders in the coming months!

1. How are you feeling? I have been able to eat most food again, but have to be careful. I have also re-gained a slight bit of weight, God be praised, but still tend to be very tired and have had to rely on more help from church members to get extras things done. (In other words, after 40 hours of office work/visits, I am tired, whereas before I could go to all hours before getting tired.) This means that I would love to have volunteers do things like change the church sign, fill the candles with oil, proofread the bulletins, make multiple phone calls and extra visits to the lonely. I am also urging members to go to Joan Mason our secretary direct rather than taking messages to pass on to her in order to cut down on my work. I will continue to preach, teach, and visit the shut-ins, but those extras need to go by the way side, until God grants me full strength! Thank-you for those volunteering to answer phones, drive guests to the airport, mop the parish hall floor, and more! It is very much appreciated! Please be patient with me as sometimes at the end of the day I am tired. Thank-you for your prayers!

2. Is Calvary Moving to Contemporary Worship? Because a majority of people at Calvary love the orders of service in the hymnal and many of the traditional hymns we will continue to use them. So, the answer in general is, “No!” However, as youth and others have gifts to play instruments, keyboards, flute, violin, trumpet, bells and voice, we will encourage and allow them to use those gifts in worship. In addition, you will hear a solo/duet by our gifted DCE Mike Kipp who has a background in more contemporary music. Granted, for some this music may feel uncomfortable, but hearing it occasionally is a good way for us to explore the good Lutheran music in the larger world. He is working to put together a youth band to play at some of our outreach services which will be “blended” in nature, God willing, this summer in Hinton. We as a church want to remain faithful to

our heritage as Lutherans, but at the same time, not be isolated from the newer Lutheran artists and Christians who have written appropriate biblical music.

3. Sometimes the beginning of Worship is Noisy and Feels Irreverent! Is the beginning of worship for prayer or is it for fellowship? The simple answer is that both are appropriate. Quiet prayer is always appropriate. People sometimes come during the week and on Saturday mornings to pray. Others take a few moments to examine themselves ahead of worship to pray. Jesus said, “My house is a house of prayer.” However, the Bible also says, “Greet One another with a holy kiss.” It likewise says, “Spur one another on to love and good works,” which happens in part before and after worship services! Granted in the 21st century we greet more with talk and a handshake or smile than a holy kiss! The elders of Calvary are presently in conversation on how to do both of these in a healthy and respectful way, especially since our culture has two different views of which is most appropriate! Biblically the answer is both! Bible study is a great place to continue such fellowship.

4. Announcement Length: My goal is to keep announcements to four at the beginning of the worship and put the rest on the screen and bulletin. We have heard the concern that they were getting too long!

Thank-you again for the questions and concerns. Our elders, Mike Kipp DCE and I love constructive feedback as it helps make us grow stronger. Keeping concerns to yourself only allows Satan to gain a foothold. However, realize as we work on concerns, there are multiple solutions and the elders will not be able to satisfy everyone perfectly. Matthew 18: “If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother.” Keep communicating direct! In Christ,

I love how this song challenges us to follow our Lord more closely and to open ourselves up to the reality of his relentless love and overwhelming power. This is the power to be washed clean from our sin and to be restored into a right relationship with Christ. The first verse puts this truth out so forthrightly and at the same time so joyfully as we acknowledge victory over evil by the power of Christ's death and resurrection. **This song is actually an amazing tool for evangelism.** As we sing it we are inviting others into the life-changing work of Jesus Christ. The struggle in this world between good and evil is exposed and the opportunity for victory in Jesus made known.

Verse 1: Would you be free from the burden of sin? There's pow'r in the blood, pow'r in the blood; Would you o'er evil a victory win? There's wonderful pow'r in the blood.

The "Power in the Blood" is the reason that we are able to move forward in fantastic ways, advancing the work of Jesus by blessing others. "Love your neighbor as yourself" is at its core. To love ourselves rightly is to be in relationship with Jesus and to be saved by his grace. If we love our neighbor as our self, then naturally we would be always communicating how it is that our Lord makes an impact on our lives every day.

These lyrics remind us of the invitation that should always be evident in our hearts, on our lips, and through our work. That is the invitation to invest in the work of Jesus, to bring Him praise through our daily lives, and to be refreshed by the power issued to us through His one true sacrifice on the cross.

During the Best Practices in Ministry Conference in Phoenix, one of the keynote speakers talked about how we need to focus more on seeking and saving those that are lost.

Luke 1:3-7 states: "So He told them this parable: "What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance."

It is so easy for us to just be comfortable and stay in our seats and remain the status quo, but God commands us to get out of our comfort zones and seek those out in our community that are lost and in desperate need of a Savior. As Easter approaches, my hope is that we all recommit ourselves to doing service for Jesus our King and to invite others into his life changing love.

Religious Service Attendance — Pastor Travis

“Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.” Psalm 100:2 Did you know it is both unethical and bad business practice for a company or business to prevent a person from going to worship? Story after story is told by young and old members who must work or play during all church services. The employer/coach insists that you must work/practice Sunday mornings and you must work/practice Wednesday evenings. However, most employers are less insisting and more assuming you have nothing else going on, because often, it has never been mentioned that you worship.

No matter what you may think of him as a politician, Donald Trump two years ago in episode of the Apprentice did an amazing thing on national TV. One of the contestants was Jewish and as a Jew he was required to celebrate Yom Kippur (The Day of Atonement) with his family. He elected to tell Trump well in advance that he could not participate in the task at hand because of his religious beliefs and celebration of Yom Kippur. His fellow contestants felt he should be fired for not showing up or even participating in the task. Trump, explained that all people’s religious beliefs should be honored and he would not be fired for celebrating Yom Kippur (By the way, every Chris-

tian’s “Day of Atonement” is Good Friday and Easter as we believe in Jesus – Every Sunday is sometimes called a Mini-Day of Atonement/Easter).

You might be surprised, most employers will gladly let you come in 2 hours late or even get off two hours early to worship. Why? Because we live in a country that respects religious freedom. Yet, don’t be surprised even if some say “no” like the contestants. We are one nation under God. I am not saying we should flaunt our beliefs. However, we are wise to insist that we need time to worship. Otherwise, employers will unknowingly walk all over our desire to worship our God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and take the Sacrament of the Altar. If you have a job that truly only works Sundays, call your pastor and have him bring you the Lord’s Supper at a different time! **“Do not give up meeting together as some are in the habit of doing, but spur one another on towards love and good works.” Hebrews 10:24-25** In Christ, Pastor James Travis
