



The Old Testament — Pastor Travis

Some have said the Old Testament is old fashioned or out of date. But only a person who has not read it can say that, because the Old Testament people were doing the same crazy things people do today. There were righteous people, affairs, homosexuality, rape, war, lies, tricks, and children born. In other words, there is nothing new under the sun.

The Old Testament is full of God working to bring his people back into a relationship with himself. The pattern:

Sin – Adam & Eve eat the forbidden fruit.

Judgment—God kicks Adam and Eve out of the Garden

Grace – God promises to send a Descendant” (Savior through Eve’s Children) to save the world.) Genesis 3:15



This pattern happens hundreds of times in the Old Testament. Many think the Old Testament is full of rules, which it does, such as the “Ten Commandments.” Yet, the reality is the most of the Old Testament is God dealing with real people just like us. God shows them their sin, judges them but calls them to repent, and then he offers his grace and forgiveness. The same is true for us and for our neighbors. Yes, there is still sin and judgment, but God wants to offer his grace again through Jesus.

Keep hearing and reading, dear friends, read *The Story* in the Bible, hear God’s Word and see over and over again how God’s plan of salvation comes to pass.

Ask the Pastor —



Is the Old Testament all Law?

Answer: The Old Testament does contain “Law” in the sense that there are commandments that:

1. Act as Curb – Keep us from doing Evil.
2. Act as a Mirror – Shows Us our Sin so that we Run in Faith to our Savior Jesus.
3. Act as a Guide – Show us how to live now that we are saved.

Yet, the Old Testament is also full of Gospel in the narrow sense. The “Gospel” simply refers to the Good News of God coming to take away our sins through Jesus.

In short Gospel = Forgiveness in Jesus! In fact, the whole Old Testament is full of this Gospel and is constantly prophesying about the coming of Jesus. The sacrifices themselves, you might say, were delivering the forgiveness of Jesus even though in and of themselves they could do nothing. Jesus after all, is the culminating ultimate Lamb sacrificed for the sins of the world.

What is Your Calling in Life? — Michael Kipp, DCE

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I don't know about you, but this summer just flew by. However, I was also so very busy both at church and in my personal life, that I got completely overwhelmed and stressed out. I took on too many things and said "yes" to too many people and had very little time with my family. I was at a point a couple of weeks ago where I was so burned out that I started questioning if I should keep doing this. Part of me wanted to run away from the stress and frustrations that comes with being a church worker, but I know that is the devil at work trying to break me down. I spent a lot of time in prayer trying to figure out what God wanted me to do, not necessarily what I wanted to do, so I went to God's Word for help. There were two scripture passages that jumped out at me that helped me during my struggles:

Matthew 11:28-30 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light"

And:

Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight."

These two passages are very uplifting for me. They remind me to just rest in God's loving arms when I am struggling in life and lean not on my own understanding, and to trust in God with all my heart and He will guide me. I will admit that there are days when it would seem easier to do something outside

of full time ministry, but I realize that God has placed on my heart this specific calling to continue doing the Lord's work.

I am reminded of people like Moses in the scriptures, who didn't want to go to Egypt to free the Israelites from Pharaoh and who felt very unqualified, but God called him to go and do that anyway.

I know that I am called by God to be a DCE at Calvary and there are times where I feel just like Moses. I am reminded in God's Word in *Matthew 28:19-20* "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Even though there are times when I feel less than adequate and get frustrated with things, I know that God is always with me and will help guide me.

My hope with this article is that when you are struggling with something in life, that rather than trying to do it on your own, go to God in prayer and spend time in His word to help guide you and He will give you the right answer in His timing. *Isaiah 55:8* says, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord."

What is your calling in life? We need to remember to lean not on our own understanding but listen to what God wants us to do because sometimes His plans and His thoughts are way better than ours. My plan wasn't to go into full time ministry, but it is what God has called me to do and that is His plan for me.


