
Our Graduates for 2024

Pastor Travis' Message-God Listens to Your Prayers

Dear Brothers and Sister of Christ of Calvary Lutheran Church,

God always answers our prayers. Future Pastor Alex being placed here at Calvary and accepting our Call indeed is a big "Yes" to our prayers. Many of us wondered, "Why are you so slow answering?" But then I am reminded that God answered God's people even slower when it came to bringing them out of slavery in Egypt to the promised land in the Old Testament: 40 Years (See the Book of Exodus)!

One of the reason's God answers prayers slow is so that he can do pruning ahead of answering the prayer. John 15:1-2: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit." It is possible God did not give us an Associate Pastor right away was that he

did not want us to "hire" a worker to do the work, but instead for us "to call" a shepherd. Shepherd's do not do the work, but they guide the sheep to do the work and bear fruit.

Certainly future Pastor Alex will do work, preaching, teaching, visiting shut-ins, and more, but he is not called to be a secre-

tary, to run all the youth events, fix all the families, or even keep the church clean. No, God has called all of us as the body of Christ each with different gifts and abilities. This past years vacancy has forced us as a church to do the youth work ourselves.

To demonstrate God's amazing pruning at work it is my prayer that you would bear fruit using your gifts in a simple way this summer:

- Day Camps People needed to help cook a meal for about 20 kids, help with the Wood Working, Art, or Cooking, and some to just guide children
- 2. Youth Board We have 3 openings starting in July for one year to help Pastor Alex with his first year of ministry. It has been said a pastor is only as good as the board that works with them. Thank-you to who have worked hard this past year. Likewise, our Board of Christian Education Board continues to lead our church to bring children up in the fear and instruction of the LORD!
- We need help with Pastor Alex' Installation and Ordination. We would like the youth to sing, bells to

play, food to be served, and guests from Denision, Carroll, and other places around the country welcomed. It is a special honor for us to have his ordination. This is not simply a welcome ceremony, but ordination is the rite through which Alex Smith will become a pastor. If you have never been to one, you will be impressed. God works mightily and you will meet pastors from all over the state and even country.

- God uses those who work behind the scenes helping with groups work that has gone on for years. Chancel Guild, Ushers, Acolytes, Board Members & Boards, etc.
- 5. Prayer The Lord simply says, "Ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened unto you." Calvary is exploring opportunities with bringing English as a Second Language classes to

our building to help show our Hispanic neighbors we care about them. Likewise, we wonder if having Spanish in one of our services would be good. Please pray that God would show us His will. Please also pray for our members that our sick, hurting, and our neighboring churches that were devastated by

the tornados this past week. We will be taking an offering May 5 and May 8 in the back of the church to help those in need!

Another prayer answered: God has brought 13 youth through four years of confirmation. Likewise, he has brought 9 students through High School. These youth are some of the most active at Calvary. Please pray that Jesus will continue to be their vine and they be His branches that produce fruit in High School, College, and jobs beyond!

Are you not excited concerning what God will do with you? With Alex Smith? With our Youth? Pray, "LORD make Calvary the place parents and youth desire to go to grow in their faith on the Northside of Sioux City! LORD make this the best place to go, provide all the leaders necessary for your Word to go out! In Jesus name. AMEN

The Calvary Call

Dear Friends in Christ,

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-25 ESV).

For several months, I have focused my articles on the fruits of the Spirit. The last fruit is self-control. There almost seems to be a contradiction here. How can self-control be a fruit of the Spirit? The word "self" would indicate that the control comes from us and not from God.

The Greek word the Apostle Paul uses in Galatians 5:25 is "ἐγκράτεια." It means "to have power over something." We often think of self-control in terms of willpower; the ability to manage one's impulses, emotions, and behaviors. We like to think we have the ability to control our own actions, emotions, or urges in order to pursue long-term goals. Willpower involves resisting short-term temptations and making choices that are the best for us. The problem is when we find ourselves failing, lack of willpower can indeed lead to feelings of guilt. When we set goals or have intentions but struggle to follow through due to a lack of discipline or self-control, it can result in disappointment and selfblame. Guilt often arises from the perception that we've failed ourselves or others. We deceive ourselves when we believe we have power over sin.

The life of a Christian is lived out in a power struggle between sin and virtue. This ongoing battle between good and evil is lived out over and over in the pages of Holy Scripture. St. Paul gives us an intense but clear picture of this battle in the book of Romans 7. I would ask you to pause reading this article and read Romans 7:6-25.

As Paul clearly demonstrates, self-control is not about willing ourselves to be good. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing (Romans 7:19 ESV). It's about recog-

nizing our total dependence on Christ. Self-control is a Christian virtue that begins and ends with Christ. The very desire to do good begins with the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. We are motivated to do good; that is, to be virtuous, not by the guilt over our sin, but by the power of God's grace. In his struggle to be good, St. Paul reaches this conclusion, Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin (Romans 7:24-25 ESV).

Self-control is clearly not about "willing" ourselves to be obedient or living in the guilt over our sin. Instead, it's a fruit of the Spirit. True self-control relies on Jesus to fight against the three-fold enemy: the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh. As Christians, we rely on God's grace to develop self-control.

This is done through prayer, repentance, confession, and absolution. By joining with other Christians in worship, through our family and private devotions, the Holy Spirit causes us to grow in self-control and honor God in our lives. In his Small Catechism, Martin Luther emphasizes self-control as part of faithful living, recognizing that it's not our effort, but rather God's work within us that enables true self-control. It is a fruit of the Spirit and I remind you again, Against this there is no law!







digging the foundations for a new development, the last thing they expected to find was a skeleton at the bottom of a well. Who the skeleton was and how it got there were two of the long-held secrets kept by the residents of Chicken Hill, the dilapidated neighborhood where immigrant Jews and African Americans lived side by side and shared ambitions and sorrows. Chicken Hill was where Moshe and Chona Ludlow lived when Moshe integrated his theater and where Chona ran the Heaven & Earth Grocery Store. When the state came looking for a deaf boy to institutionalize him, it was Chona and Nate Timblin, the Black janitor at Moshe's theater and the unofficial leader of the Black community on Chicken Hill, who worked together to keep the boy safe.

As these characters' stories overlap and deepen, it becomes clear how much the people who live on the margins of white, Christian America struggle and what they must do to survive. When the truth is finally revealed about what happened on Chicken Hill and the part the town's white establishment played in it, McBride shows us that even in dark times, it is love and community—heaven and earth—that sustain us. as Deacon King Kong and as inventive as The Good Lord Bird.




