

## Pastor Travis' Message-Seek First the Kingdom of God

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Bible says, "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things will be added unto you." Matthew 6:33

Jesus reminds me I can always get better at seeking him first and Doing His righteousness! The first half of the verse is more about my attitude: Am I seeking God's kingdom? Am I requesting God's rule in my prayers? Am I mining God's Word for instructions on Jesus directing me in my life after all He is my king.

So often I find myself being directed by other kings: bills, sports schedules, pressure to be at events for friends and family, my work as a pastor. Other kings are not bad, but are they second? Do I seek them less than I seek God?

The second half of the verse is also tough: "Seek... His righteousness!" What is God's righteousness. Unlike the first half of the verse that deals more with attitude, righteousness deals more with action. Am I seeking living the right way as: being a better husband or wife, being a better neighbor, helping the needy better God's way, etc.?

Seeking to be better is an endless rabbit hole that consumes our life. Pastor how dare you add more to my over committed life! This is where our next 40 weeks reading the "Story" will help us sort out the meat from the fat in our life, the wheat from the chaff.

Seeking first the kingdom, means first slowing down and literally stopping some of our business and starting seeking God first. Then after stopping we restart seeking God's kingdom in all areas of our life. God after all is not opposed to bills, sports, friends and family. In fact he loves all of these and wants us to carry out His righteousness that we learn in His words while we are with them.

Plus, we learn from God's Word to have work/ rest balance. The fourth commandment says, "Remember the Sabbath Day by Keeping it Holy." What does this mean? Luther writes, "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching or His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

I want to challenge all of you to read just a little more of the Bible this school year. If you have never read the Bible through, I challenge you to pick up a Story Bible and you will read 1/3 of the Bible. If you have read the Story, I challenge you to read even more, pick up a Bible lectionary and read one, two, or three chapters each day and go through the Bible in I to 3 years. You will find this experience rewarding.

If you don't think you have time to read that much simply come to church or join a Bible Class on the Story and hear and dig into the lessons fear each day! There is a plan for almost any schedule. There is one schedule I would not recommend: Putting Jesus kingdom and His righteousness second. The result? Anxiety and worry because you must provide everything without God's help. God's blessings as we all walk together seeking God first. Jesus after all sought you before you even knew Him! He died and rose for you! In Christ,

## Pastor Alex' Message-The Hourglass of Life

Dear friends in Christ.

Psalm 90, verse I0 tells us that the years of our life are seventy or, by some reason, of strength eighty, yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away. I do not mean to be morbid, but we all have a clock on our lives here on this earth. From the moment of our birth to the day of our death, that clock dropped sand slowly but surely. It's a stark reminder of the fleeting nature of life, urging us to reflect and contemplate on our journey. Once it runs out, we can not just flip it over and restart our lives; no we must sleep the sleep of peace until he who will say arise, o sleeper comes with the blast of the trumpet.

Now, you may ask yourself, why is our new associate pastor talking about death in his second newsletter article? Well, I just helped with my first funeral here as a pastor at Calvary this last month. The event that really sparked this, though, was one I had a small hand in putting together. My Grandpa and Grandma Smith celebrate sixty years of marriage this year. As part of their celebration, I asked them if they wanted to do a renewal of vows ceremony. They said that they would be happy to do it, so I sat down with a template and wrote out the necessary things I needed to carry out this ceremony, such as names and how many years in marriage they had spent together. As I stood up there doing the ceremony, I thought the time was flying, and I did not have much left. In the blink of an eye, I'll be a decade into my ministry; I will have done many more baptisms, hopefully some weddings and a few funerals. I am here to guide you in these reflections and to support you in making the most of your time.

In this fleeting life, after a loved one or friend passes away, I have heard it said, "If I only had more time with that person we'd take one last fishing trip, we'd take one last family vacation, I would listen to that story that grandpa likes to tell time and time again when I was a kid. When he would start into it, I would roll my eyes, but by the end, I was a captivated audience sitting on the floor, cherishing every detail and the warmth of those memories.

When a loved one dies, sometimes it feels like a part of you goes with them. In 2025, it will be twenty years since my great-grandpa Harold John Smith

passed away. He and I had a bond that I still cannot explain. I was on H.J.'s lap whenever there was a family gathering. We were inseparable; I will tell you, after his funeral in 2005, it probably took me ten years or so to get through the song on Eagles Wings without crying my eyes out. That song was played at his funeral, and at that time, it felt like I had lost my rock here on earth.

When we mourn the death of a loved one, we do not mourn as others do, as the apostle Paul writes in I Thessalonians; But we do not want you to be uninformed brothers about those who have fallen asleep. That you may not grieve as those who have no hope, for since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. For this we declare to you by a word from the Lord that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep, for the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord. So, as we watch the sand in our hourglass and in the hourglasses of our loved ones slowly drop until the day when Christ either returns or calls us home, we live our lives in the good graces that God has given us. Live a life that is holy and pleasing to God, and

do not worry about how much time is left. For when we see the Lord what a glorious sight it will be.

### Visa for a Dream: Finding True Fulfillment in **God's Promise**

In 1989, Juan Luis Guerra, a popular singer from the Dominican Republic, recorded a song titled "Visa Para Un Sueño" (Visa for a Dream). The song addresses the challenging process of applying for a visa to enter the USA or another country. The dream it describes is to achieve a better life and escape the repression, poverty, violence, and injustices of one's own country. The lyrics depict the experience of standing in line at 5 a.m., carrying a stack of documents, photographs, and copies required for the visa application. The line moves slowly, the tropical sun beats down, and when one finally reaches the window to present the documents, they are rejected without explanation. This leads to feelings of frustration, anger, and hopeless-

ness. The song resonated in Latin America because it reflected the dreams and despair of many people. Unfortunately, many who obtained a visa and relocated discovered that no place is perfect. Economic problems, violence, illness, and disasters can occur anywhere.

The only true dreams that come to fruition are the desires and goals of God for our well-being, both here and in the hereafter. As Psalm 126:1-3 states: "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream. Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with shouts of joy; then they said among the nations, 'The Lord has done great things for them.' The Lord has done great things for us; we are glad." Our dreams of a perfect house, job, family, country, or retirement may never come true, but the Lord has done more than we could ask or imagine by bringing us into His family and kingdom through the work of His beloved Son. May the Lord help us to invite others into this very real salvation and "dream relationship with God."

WHEREAS, Human life, even though marred by the Fall and resulting in sin and death, has a unique and valued place in God's creation (Genesis 9:6; Psalm 8:5); and

WHEREAS, Our Lord Jesus Christ sanctified human life by His incarnation, crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension; and

WHEREAS, God, through His Word and His Spirit, uses even things that the world sees as limitations for His glory and for the good of our neighbor (Romans 8:28; I Corinthians 12:22); and

WHEREAS, God may heal certain diseases or conditions through medicine and technology to ameliorate incapacity and suffering (Jeremiah 8:22; Ecclesiastes 3:3); and

WHEREAS, God has provided His Word to reveal the Christ, to tell us how He gives faith, to give us hope, and to enable us to live lives pleasing to Him (John 5:39; Ephesians 2:8; Hebrews 11:1; I Thessalonians 4:1; I Peter 3:15); and

WHEREAS, God has given those baptized into Christ His Holy Spirit to guide them into all truth and comfort them in life and in death (John 16:13; John 14:16); and

WHEREAS, Transhumanism is a mindset and movement that attempts to achieve immortality through human efforts; and

WHEREAS, Transhumanism endeavors to enhance human nature beyond the abilities and function given by God; and

WHEREAS, Transhumanism embodies the Darwinist idea that humans, having evolved from lower forms of life, are therefore capable of evolving into a "master race" with the help of technology and psychology; and

WHEREAS, Transhumanism, as an ideology and a pursuit, represents a faith and doctrine that is incompatible with Christianity; therefore, be it RESOLVED, That all in Christ should give thanks to God for all that He provides for our good as ones created, redeemed, and called to be His own; and be it further

RESOLVED, That Lutherans For Life recognizes technology as a divine blessing to be used in faith toward Him and love toward the neighbor (examples include the Roman roads that were used to spread the Gospel and the printing press that was used to spread the Reformation); and be it further

RESOLVED, That all in Christ should be wise in the use of all technology so as not give any opportunity to Satan to tempt those in Christ or further his efforts to deceive by imitation of works of God; and be it further

RESOLVED, That Lutherans For Life opposes Transhumanism as defined above, as contrary to God's will and encourages all to remain aware of its nature and evil effects, most notably the rejection of the glory and promises of God in Christ; and be it finally RESOLVED, That all in Christ should not attempt to transcend our God-given human nature and functions, but rather seek to fulfill our God-created purpose.

Christians are called to love and serve their neighbors according to the example of Jesus Christ.

"[[esus said,] 'A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are that is not payment for something owed to them. to love one another" (John 13:34).


